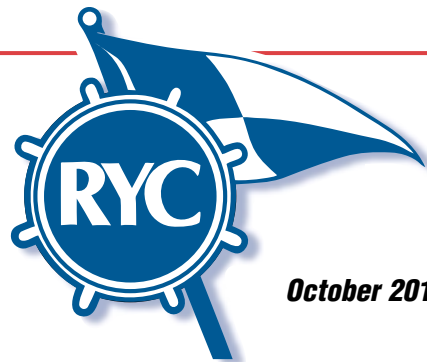

Commodore's Report

Boating season is about over. Where did the summer go? Racing, cruising, canoeing, kayaking, motor boating, sailing class? There was certainly enough to do and I hope everyone enjoyed 2010. It was definitely hot enough, actually felt like summer for a change.

Our final race for the season, The Blue Nose was sailed in some very challenging conditions. A little bit of everything – thunder, lightening, hail, wind, calm, waves and flat water. You name it, we had it...except for snow. The Shrimp Boil, which followed racing was a great success. Thank you to everyone who helped and participated.

Thanks also to the Star fleet. They were back on the water Sunday to get the race marks out, cleaned and stored. Nice job!

Work is progressing in earnest on the north retaining wall and should be complete for haul out. Masts are being pulled on Friday, October 15 and boats will be hauled out the following day, Saturday, October 16. If you are pulling boats, you are expected to “lend a hand” until the final docks are pulled. It is a group effort for your benefit. Be part of the team for the whole game, and be careful. Sorry I won't be there – *Raised By Wolves* and crew will be in Tennessee for a little late season S2 7.9 racing.

If you missed the September General Membership Meeting here is a brief discussion on the survey results. We had approx 140 responses. That is about 50% of our membership, which is really good. Overall membership is pleased with the Club and Club members. The biggest area of concern is “value for the dollar / prices” and quality of service in the dining room and bar. The House Director and Flag Officers will be addressing this in the very near future. Over 50% use the Club twice a week or more. Other observations made: Members would like to see an increase in winter activities and sailboats for member use. Charlie Manning has started a family sailing program and Entertainment will work on winter activities. As for non-member use of the Club, we performed a 3-week survey and found very few non-member/guest/visiting yachtsmen in the Club. It is the decision of the board to manage that on a case by case basis. We strongly encourage and value the interclub relations we have and will continue with our current policy. It is

encouraging to note that many respondents realize that growth of membership lies hand in hand with the future of the Club.

Some interesting facts: average age of members is 63, average age for joining is 44 and average length of time as a member is 19 years (thanks to Kim for the data).

Please remember this is a members' club. It was built and is maintained with the hard work, dedication and skills of our membership. In order to keep the cost of membership at a reasonable level that type of participation needs to continue and grow. We can use your skills in house, yard or pier work, planning, marketing and parties just to name a few. Come on and get involved. We are working up to our 100th anniversary in 2016. Let's make sure we get there in style.

All in all as I look back on the 2010 boating season, it was a very good year!

From the September Board meeting minutes:

Office Manger Kim Shortess reported her findings for insuring the Star model in the foyer. After discussion, the Board advised her to add the rider to the policy and to investigate the cost of insuring the other pieces of Club-owned art.

Shortess reported that Jim Rooney Jr. arranged for the donation of various pieces of galley equipment, which is very much appreciated. The Board requested she send a thank you.

Membership Secretary Jan Guthrie presented the membership status changes:

All status changes were approved.

McGauran announced he will be building a shed in the back galley yard to contain all the various items that now sit out in the open.

Yard Director Greg Schneberger was asking for volunteers to help complete the seawall project. Shortess planned to send

out an e-mail blast with dates and times that work parties were needed.

Schneberger requested the Board address the smoking issues at the Club as he has been getting requests from members for a place to smoke once cold weather comes in. He also requests that smokers be more courteous of non-smokers by using the sand-filled flower pots and ashtrays that are scattered around the grounds.

Race Director Bob Sample announced the Awards Banquet will be held on January 22, 2011 at Meadowbrook Country Club.

Sample thanked the race committee and all Club members who made the regattas in the past month so successful.

Sample led a discussion regarding a review of the trophy case. He will form a committee to do so.

McGauran requested a status update on the race committee boat windlass. Sample assured him it is in working order.

In Memoriam

Recent RYC member, Don Taylor, passed away on Sunday, September 19th in South Portland, Maine. Present was his friend Kate Hodgson, and his son Nat, and daughters, Kit and Tori. Kate reported that Don was comfortable and content to have the most important people in his life present in his last moments.

On August 2, 2009 Don and Kate left Racine and began a sailing voyage to South Portland, Maine. Kate flew home to Portland following the Lake Michigan leg of the journey. Don spent much of the remaining time solo sailing *Whisper* through the Great Lakes, the Erie Canal, Hudson River and north to Maine where he lived until his untimely death. His thoughts and musings were recorded in yachtwhisper.blogspot.com.

Following his trip, Don sought to re-establish his career out east. March of this year, Don experienced pain near his pelvis.

And what he thought was a routine orthopedic injury turned out to be an aggressive cancer found in his pelvis. Radiation therapy and chemotherapy proved fruitless as the cancer spread to his lungs and liver.

Don will always be remembered for his indomitable and energetic spirit. He was always quick with a joke and had a humorous story for practically every situation. Don was a lifelong sailor who grew up in rural Maine and had owned a number of sailboats throughout his life. Enviously, he had sailed much of the east coast, parts of the west coast and of course the Great Lakes. His last boat, and the one we are familiar with, was *Whisper*, the black hulled boat originally owned by Hal Roth, who with his wife, circumnavigated the earth three times in over twenty years of sailing.

Don, in typical "Don" fashion, wished not to have a funeral, but rather that everyone honor his memory and celebrate life. His ashes will be spread by his children in areas that were special to him. Please keep Don and his family in your thoughts and prayers.

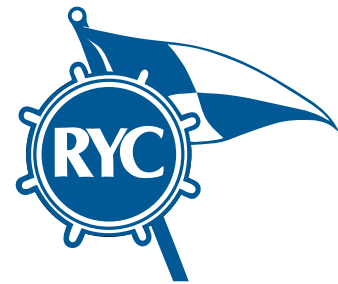
