TREASURER'S REPORT: Greg Miller Financial Results

February marks the start of our new fiscal year and net income was \$17,000 favorable vs. budget. Largest Variances include:

• Income: Favorable +\$13,000 primarily driven by timing of class fees and recognition of fundraising income

• Expense: Favorable +\$4,000 primarily driven by budget pacing

•Kim and I have been in discussions with our accountant and will recognize fundraising income as part of our overall operations in the P&L. This will create favorability to our results (vs. budget) throughout the year and also bring visibility to the progress of our bathroom remodel financial goals.

• Two tranches of CDs will be maturing within the next 120 days and a decision needs to be made on reinvesting for another 9 months with Summit Credit Union. Current rates are 4.85%. The decision should be based on the probability of dredging within the next 12 months.

Raced several boats, from Hobies to a Peterson 34 circa 1982 to 1995. I retired after 44 years of banking and insurance, and decided to take up a secondary residence in Charleston, South Carolina about 7 years ago.

I continued my love of boating in the Lowcountry, and purchased a 22' bayboat which I slipped on the Folly River. After having my boat (Maggie May ll – named after the nickname given to Dale Olesen a former RYC member and close friend) inspected by the Coast Guard Auxiliary pursuant to our Marina rules, I was invited to join the local Flotilla 070-12-08, based at Station Charleston.

I became active in the Flotilla and attained Boatcrew and Coxswain (small boat chief) Rating.

I was honored to have been elected the Charleston Commander as of the first of this year.

For those of you not familiar with the Auxiliary, we are a volunteer component of the United States Coast Guard. We have two Basic areas of responsibility:

Recreational Boating Safety- this includes Vessel Exams, Boating Safety classes, Dealer visits, Public Affairs (ie-boat shows).

Active Duty Augmentation-Search and Rescue, Maritime Safety, Pollution Patrol, Aids to Navigation, Culinary Arts, Watchstanding and much more. We are not involved in any Military or law enforcement activities.

Charleston was just recognized as a "Coast Guard Community" in part because of the growth of the fleet of 7- 420" Security Cutters. I was privileged to be on a shakedown cruise on board the Cutter Stone. We are the largest Flotilla in South Carolina and have a very active membership. As with most branches of the Military, the Coast Guard is understaffed, and using the Auxiliary as a Force Multiplier is a key way to support their Mission.

It's a pleasure and honor to support our Country and the Coast Guard. Happy to say my Grandson will be taking sailing lessons down at the Club this Summer!


