Commodore's Report


Happy Spring!

February was a positive month with Net Income of \$30,435 vs. a budget of \$8,404. Higher revenue from youth sailing class fees (+\$9,000) and unbudgeted HOOK sponsorship from Riverside (+\$3,000) helped drive the favorable variance.

Our total checking and savings balance is \$219,000 which is \$95,000 higher than the same time one year ago.


