Sailing, it's what we do at Racine Yacht Club!

This year was the 39th running of the HOOK race. This is RYC's premier long distance race from Racine to Menomonee Michigan, a 189 nautical mile trek. The boats head North "hooking" through Death's Door (Porte Des Morts passage), a narrow and often treacherous passageway between Washington Island and Wisconsin's Door County Peninsula, continuing across Green Bay, and ending in Menominee, Michigan.

New this year was the Super HOOK, which after passing through the finish in Menomonee they race back to Racine. Five boats registered for the Super HOOK; however, due to equipment failures, and time constraints only 1 boat, Dale Smirl's, Defiance finished the Super HOOK! Congratulations, Defiance!

This year was considered to be a slow race. Many of my friends and fellow Yacht Club members were on the race and it gave me comfort to know they were not subject to danger with crazy strong winds and storms as we have had in the past.



Many thanks to our members who volunteered their time to assure the race goes off without a hitch. It takes an army of people to attend to big details such as registration all the way down to making sure the garbage is emptied. RYC News in Brief

RECORDING SECRETARY: Carol Stanley

The minutes of the June 9, 2022 board meeting approved as written. Maddie Lyon spoke to the board to comment on the minutes from the June 9th meeting about the Youth Sailing Notes stating the racing group is dwindling. Maddie said the group is not dwindling but is going strong. They have 10 to 15 boats out on Tuesday nights.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Frank Randall

We had a good month with an adjusted income of \$ 2,415. For the year our adjusted income is \$ 45,006. These are positive results! Frank was asked why \$2400, as it sounded low for a summer month. We have a lot of activities coming up which we are paying for. The water level of Lake Michigan appears to be at the seasonal peak. It is currently seven inches below last year and is at the same level as last month. The Corp of Engineers looks for no net change in level during the next month. I added two new plots to the report. One shows the member numbers in each RYC class over the last few years. The other shows the increase in dues for an Act 30 member. It has doubled in the last twenty years from \$400 a year to \$800 a year. This is an average increase of \$20 a year.

COMMODORE'S REPORT: Amy Cermak

I'd like to thank our caterer, Erica for always taking care of our youth sailors by making sure they are hydrated and well fed.

June was a busy month for me racing my Diamond Girl in Chicago; unfortunately, I was unable to attend our Open House and Tri-Club Rendezvous. I understand that Theresa Rooney, Kurt Lasson and their committee did an awesome job showcasing our club. Amy sent an email out about the costs of securing the east door with a pushbar exit and fob entry. For safety reasons the door should be kept locked. Frank also reminded us the IRS requires a private club to have locked doors. Frank moved (Sean 2nd) we order the push bar and fob access for the east door. Passed. Sean asked about the door being locked at all times. It is unlocked on Wednesday race nights as some of the crew are not


