
## Commodore's Report

## RYC News in Brief

The minutes of the January board meeting approved as written/corrected.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT:

Greg Miller Monthly Results December was a negative month with Net Income of (-\$9,723) vs. a budget of \$5,579. YTD our Net Income is \$37,782 vs. a budget of (-\$4,145) creating a budget surplus of \$41,927. There were two drivers behind our negative month. First, we paid our \$9,000 annual lease and second, we had pier expenses of \$1,950 related to replacement of electrical panels, circuit monitors and WiFi. All expenses were in the annual budget and monthly timing drove the variance. Club savings declined \$20,000 as revenue is lower than expenses this time of year. (Balance = \$180,030)

#### **Budget Files**

The budget files for next year have been prepared and shared with each board member. Project lists are still being finalized, but we are not expecting a deficit and will either have a balanced budget or a surplus which we will save towards larger expenses such as dredging.

January 6 th Water Levels
Lake Michigan is 2 inches below last
month and 9 inches below the same
time one year ago. It is projected
to drop 1 inch each over the next
month. We are 4 inches above
the long term monthly average of
January.






