December 2022 Treasurers Report Monthly Results

November was a positive month with Net Income of \$3,965 vs. a budget of \$1,355. YTD our Net Income is \$43,918 vs. a budget of (-\$9,723) creating a budget surplus of \$53,641. Part of our favorability is driven by timing as we still need to pay our property lease of \$9,500. No other significant payments are expected and we should finish the year with positive income. Club savings was unchanged vs. Oct. (Balance = \$200,014)

**Budget Files** 

Attached is the preliminary budget file. Different from last year, individual tabs have been created to provide insights and greater alignment of revenue and expenses. Kim and I will work on a draft over the coming weeks, but appreciate everyone's input by end of December for improvement projects or changes to revenue/expenses. I will provide a consolidated view by January 5th and we can use the next Board meeting on January 12th to finalize.

December 2nd Water Levels
Lake Michigan is 4 inches below last
month and 9 inches below the same
time one year ago. Lakes Superior and
Michigan-Huron are in their seasonal
decline and are projected to drop 3
inches each over the next month.
La Niña conditions, which are likely
to happen in the winter of 2022-23,
indicate a high probability water levels
should rise during the spring/summer
and could postpone dredging. (See
graph below) We will monitor closely
over the coming months as dredging is a
significant expenditure.


