TREASURER'S REPORT:

Monthly Results
January was a positive month with
Net Income of \$5,212 vs. a budget of
\$2,263. There were no big surprises
in the month.

Annual Results January marks the end of our fiscal year.

Our Net Income finished +\$42,933 vs. a budget of +\$9,249 creating a budget surplus of \$33,684.

- The biggest driver of revenue vs. 2021 was the increase in membership dues.
- •Our revenue from membership increased \$32,993.
- •All committees did an excellent job of managing expenses.
- •Our major expenditure for the year was the reroofing of the Richter building.
- •Total Checking and Savings ended the year with a balance of \$212,190, notably higher than the previous year as we continue saving for expenditures such as dredging and replacing the roof on the clubhouse.

February 3rd Water Levels Lake Michigan's water level matches its level of a month ago and is 5 inches below a year ago. We are +4 inches above the long term monthly average. Lake Michigan is predicted to hover near its current level next month.

As a skipper of a racing boat


